## First Congressional Debate

Richard Freedman

Jim Perry, host of the Billerica Access TV show Billerica News, was quick to issue invitations for the first televised debate of the 5th Congressional race from the campaigns of Libertarian Ilana Freedman, Democrat incumbent Marty Meehan, and the two Republicans in the race, Chuck McCarthy and Tom Tierney.

Two days before the debate, Meehan told the Boston Globe that he would not participate in the debate since he would be appearing on The Capitol Gang that night instead. It was later learned that the national show was taped the night before and Meehan was back in town the evening of the debate. When Perry finally heard from the Meehan campaign, they called not to apologize, but to ask him not to have an empty chair representing Meehan. The show was televised with an extra chair and dangling microphone which were introduced as the incumbent. In one of the best laugh-getters of the evening, Freedman turned slightly to face the empty chair and asked "Marty" a question.

The candidates acquitted themselves well — or at least Freedman and McCarthy did. Questions were asked on several major topics. On Homeland Security, Freedman staunchly opposed the idea that it was either necessary or appropriate to sacrifice liberty for security, arguing that empowering the people was the best way to protect both security and liberty. On improving the 5th District, Freedman argued for improving the climate for small business by reducing government regulations and bureaucracy. On Medicare, she argued for alter-

native health care solutions while McCarthy proposed wage controls and Tierney proposed price controls. On the question "What is the proper role of government in marriage?" Freedman had a one-word answer, "None." But Tierney chose to respond, "What this question is really about is homosexual marriage. I'm against it. Homosexuality is a birth defect, like left-handedness or color-blindness." Tierney also said that Social Security would remain fiscally sound for quite a number of years, if the government would just pay back the money borrowed from the Social Security surplus. His final remark was that the problem can be left for today's kids to solve it when they grow up.

### Endorsements

Ilana Freedman has scored a rare coup in winning endorsements from two national groups — despite the presence of a Republican in the race. Ilana has been endorsed by the NTUCF, the political action arm of the 335,000 member National Taxpayers Union. In the endorsement, President John Berthoud stated, "Ilana Freedman will be a tremendous asset to the taxpayers of the 5th District...Ilana is the candidate of less government and lower taxes and is the most attuned to the families of this district." Bertoud added, "Ilana is the obvious choice for taxpayers and NTUCF is proud to endorse her for Congress."

Ilana has also won the endorsement of the Veterans' Voting Bloc. This is particularly significant because Republican McCarthy is a veteran.

# Libertarians Dominate Freedom Rally!

We had a great day!

Carla Howell and Michael Cloud gave rousing speeches, exciting the crowd about their Libertarian campaigns, and Ending the War on Drugs.

After their speeches, Michael Cloud and Carla Howell each shook the hands with and spoke to over 1,500 people.

"As Governor, I will repeal every state law and regulation against Marijuana," Carla Howell told over 35,000 rally attendees. "As Governor, I will do everything in my power to pardon and free all non-violent drug offenders. Governor Carla Howell will shred every law on the books that infringes on your right to choose what to put in your body, or how to live your life."

"I declare a Drug Peace," said Michael Cloud. "End Drug Prohibition Now. End the Drug War Now. Amnesty. Pardons. Peace."

Thirty-two volunteers helped us give the World's Smallest Political Quiz to over 564 people! Never before have we given the Quiz to so many people in a single day. Of all the people taking the quiz, 297 scored in the Libertarian quadrant, or on the Libertarian border. Over 154 people gave us their names and asked that we send them more information about the Libertarian Party and our candidates.

We also collected 39 voter registrations — of which 27 registered Libertarian!

We have attended this event for a number of years now. Every year, more of the people we speak to are familiar with Libertarian positions and candidates, and more and more they agree with us and score as Libertarian on the World's Smallest Political Quiz. This is a great testament to the work we have done spreading our small government message.

## This Month in Libertarian History

### October 2002

This month marks the 29th anniversary of the death of one of the most famed defenders of liberty in history. Ludwig von Mises was born in 1881 in the Austro-Hungarian city of Lemberg. By age 29, he had earned his Ph.D. from the University of Vienna and was on his way to becoming one of the greatest free market economists of the 20th century. His first and most famous work, *The Theory of Money and Credit*, argued that the "price" of money should be determined as any other commodity in a free market economy, by the forces of supply and demand. This was in sharp contrast to earlier Austrian economists who believed that the concept of money should be separated from the rest of the economy. During the 1920s, Mises formed the Austrian Institute for Business Cycle Research and hired F.A. Hayek, who later

won a Nobel prize for his work on Mises' trade cycle theory. Also during this time, Mises was one of the few to predict both the great depression and the fall of the communist system. After emigrating to the United States with his wife in 1940, Mises wrote *Bureaucracy* which warned against the dangers of the growing federal bureaucracy in the United States. While he was alive, the work of Mises was often considered outdated and misguided. He won few if any academic awards for his 25 books and more than 250 scholarly articles. However, none of this fazed him from carrying on his fight for Austrian economics and freedom. Although his greatness was not recognized during his lifetime, today his works are widely read by students, economists and philosophers, and his ideas are inspiring people around the world. Ludwig von Mises died in New York City at the age of 92, on October 10th of 1973.
