Most of us get lots of requests for money.

In these interesting times, many of us wonder if our donations will be spent well. With the Massachusetts Libertarians, you don't have to worry. Your state committee has set down in advance how we will spend your money. Effectively.

From every payment of dues, we'll spend
\$3 to support volunteer activities
\$3 for outreach and Federal candidates
\$3 for fundraising and member recruitment
\$3 for renewal notices
\$3 for administration and a reserve fund.

Volunteer activities — that's money for meetup groups
Outreach and candidates — that's booths at Boston Pride, the Freedom Rally, and more
Fundraising and Membership — direct Action to build a larger party
Renewal notices — we'll spend less than \$3 if you renew early
Administration and reserve — That's a lot for administration. We wish it were less.
Administration is fixed costs: a postal box. Credit card processing. The web site. URL fees. As we grow, your share of those costs will fall.

(If you order the paper newsletter, \$10 a year goes to printing and mailing.)

If you donate above dues, we allocate your money, too:
50% for candidates and issues
30% for fundraising
20% for administration and a reserve fund.

We'd really love to have your support for local candidates and local advertising. The Federal and State Governments do not make life easy for us. That donation has to be made with a separate check. Please mark the check "state" and we'll use it to support local candidates and non-Federal activities.
